## Tuesday, April 7 ~ Pray at All Times ~ Lamentations 1:17-22

The definition for lamentations is the passionate expression of grief or sorrow; weeping. The prophet Jeremiah was greatly disturbed over the destruction of Judah, Jerusalem, and the Temple by the Babylonians in 586 BC. He was also grieved about the general condition of the Hebrew people and their disregard for God. The entire nation was suffering.

At some point we will all face some type of adversity: loss of family and friends, loss of a job, health issues, addictions, and other tribulation. Sometimes adversity is a result of something directly attributed to us and sometimes the adversity we face is not directly attributed to us. Jeremiah shows us that we should call on God at all times no matter what. Throughout Lamentations, Jeremiah expresses Adoration (give God praise & honor), Confession (let God know what is heavy on your heart), Thanksgiving (let God know what you are grateful for) and Supplication (praying for the needs of others). When you pray, think about the acronym ACTS (Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, and Supplication). During this season of Lent, be sure to constantly be in contact and communication with God. Let Him know how you feel and take the time to listen.

My young men and young women have gone into exile.
